Getting Started with QuaverMusic

Once logged in, you'll be taken to your dashboard. It's your one-stop shop for all your QuaverMusic resources! The dashboard can be broken down into two categories: **Support Tools** and **Instructional Resources**.



- **Support Tools:** The top of the dashboard contains tools that will help you organize your teaching resources.
- **Instructional Resources:** The bottom of the dashboard includes ready-to-launch resources and information to support your instruction.



Student Access for Omaha Field Testing

There are many ways to create and manage student accounts. For the purpose of field testing, we will walk you through manual creation of student accounts.

NOTE: QuaverEd does offer SSO and rostering integration should your district choose to move forward. This would eliminate the need for students to have a username and password and would allow them to access QuaverMusic through the district's portal.




Student Admin is your one-stop shop for managing classes. Here, you can create classes and student accounts, manage assignments, or reward student progress. Navigate to 'Student Admin' from your dashboard to begin.

Create a Class

In Student Admin, select Classes.

- → Step 1: Click +Add New Class at the bottom of the Classes window.
- → Step 2: Add your Class Details. Only the class name, start, and end dates are required.
- → Step 3: Click Save. Once saved, the class will appear in Classes. Repeat the process for other classes.
- → Step 4: You will give your students the Class Code for the class you want them to join. You can find this in Classes, by the name of your class.






Guide Students to Create Their Accounts

- → Step 1: Take the class code that you generated when you created your class.
- → Step 2: Students visit QuaverEd.com/LogIn and click the Sign Up! button.
- → Step 3: Students click the Student button.
- → Step 4: Students enter the Class Code given to them by the teacher then click Continue. NOTE: Students only need to enter the Class Code the first time they login.
- → Step 5: Students are prompted to create their own usernames and passwords. The username must be 6 characters, and the password must be 8 characters. Confirm the password and click the SUBMIT button to finish.

Students can then log in from QuaverEd.com/LogIn!

Editing Student Accounts

You can always edit student information after students have created their accounts. You must first select the Class and in the bottom right corner select Enable Grid Editing (see image). Then you can modify student information, reset student's passwords, and archive students.







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QuaverMusic Lessons

The Quaver Curriculum icon is where your primary curriculum resides. Here, you can access a full year's worth of lessons for grades Pre-K through 8th grade, organized by lesson or by unit. Grades K–5 offer 12 units with three lessons each, while lessons in grades 6–8 are designed for project-based learning.

Select the Quaver Curriculum icon from your Dashboard to open the Lessons Selection Menu. Choose a Grade, organize lessons by suggested order or unit, and select a lesson title to launch.



After selecting a lesson, multiple options are available:

- Objectives The student learning goals for the lesson
- Overview The purpose of the lesson
- Worksheets Printables related to the lesson
- Lesson Plan A PDF version of the full lesson to save or print
- Launch Launch the lesson in the Lesson Plan Presenter window.

Once the lesson is launched, use the arrows to paginate through the lesson screens.
